

Please be aware that the same course from Bergen Community College may be accepted in transfer for a different course within different majors at Johnson & Wales. This agreement is based on Johnson & Wales' 2007-2008 catalog.

Listed below are courses from your institution, which will be accepted as transfer credits. It is recommended that students select courses listed below when developing their schedule. Transfer credit can only be earned in the following manner:

- students must earn a minimum grade of "C"
- students must select a major to ensure the proper awarding of transfer credit
- Johnson & Wales will evaluate course-by-course to reflect students' curriculum
- course credit hours must equate to the course credit hours assigned to Johnson & Wales courses
- **This agreement will expire in May, 2008 and will be re-evaluated according to updates in curriculum.**
