TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

BERGEN COMMUNITY COLLEGE

AND

The intent of this agreement is to facilitate the smooth transfer and transition of Bergen Community College (Bergen) graduates into appropriate upper level programs. The successful implementation of the Agreement depends upon communication of its contents to all involved participants, and assumptions of responsibility by both institutions for such communication.

The Agreement is based upon the completion of an Associate Degree in the programs identified in the Agreement.



The terms of this Agreement take effect with students graduating in December 2008. Programmatic changes by either institution will necessitate amendments to this Agreement as appropriate.

The following conditions, equivalencies and recommendations have been identified by the two institutions participating in this Agreement.

- I. Criteria for admission to the School of Business, Public Administration and Information Sciences
 - a. Minimum grade point average of 2.00, as determined by the Office of Admissions. A minimum grade point average of 3.0 is required for admission to the dual B.S. /M.S. degree in Accounting.
 - b. Meet general admission requirements to Long Island University, Brooklyn Campus.
 - c. Specific course program criteria
 - d. Bergen students who complete one of the programs recommended in Appendix A will be prepared to enroll in junior-level major courses and can realistically expect to complete the Long Island University Bachelor of Science in 4 year Accounting, Computer Science, Finance, Integrated Information Systems, Management, Marketing, degree in 4-5 semesters of full time-study. Students will prepare their academic plans with advisors in the School of Business, Public Administration and Information Sciences.
- II. Course equivalencies and/or area requirements.
Specific course equivalencies have been determined and approved and are indicated in the Appendix A. A minimum grade of C is required in all courses.
- III. Preferred course, program or degree options, including electives.
Transfer students with Associate in Science degrees have the following preferred degree options at Long Island University, Brooklyn Campus:

A.S. Accounting	B.S. Accounting (4 year) or B.S. /M.S. Accounting (5 years)

A.S. Marketing	B.S. Finance/Marketing/Management
A.S. Computer Science	B.S. Computer Science/Integrated Information Systems
A.S. Information Systems	B.S. Integrated Information Systems/Computer Science

IV. The following courses have been approved by the School of Business, Public Administration and Information Sciences for transfer credit from the AS degrees in Business Administration Accounting, Computer Science, Information Technology, Finance, Marketing and Management degree in from Bergen Community College (Bergen) toward the BS degree in Accounting, Computer Science, Finance, Integrated Information Systems, Management, and Marketing at Long Island University, Brooklyn Campus. All courses transferred to the Brooklyn Campus must have a grade of 'C' or better for credit to be received. Appendix A establishes the course equivalencies between the two institutions. All degrees should allow for 59 credits to be transferred.

** (Bus 101 and WEX 101 courses will not transfer)

V. Bergen graduates, who apply to Long Island University under the terms of this agreement, will have the admission application fee waived.

VI. Bergen students who are admitted to Long Island University under the terms of this agreement will be eligible to apply for the combined B.S./M.S. degree that will satisfy the requirement of five years of accounting education, which is required by most states to become a CPA.

- h. Transfer students who have an accumulative grade point average, of 3.3 – 3.75 or higher are eligible for Academic Scholarships and Grants. These awards range from \$2,000 to approximately \$10,000.

VIII. Both Bergen Community College (Bergen) and Long Island University, Brooklyn Campus agree to:

- a) Monitor the academic performance of students enrolling under the agreement, identifying problems, and working cooperatively to adjust course sequence and content so that students can transfer with no academic disruptions.
- b) Arrange transfer meetings to update major course equivalencies between Long Island University, Brooklyn Campus and Bergen Community College
- c) Notify each other concerning any contemplated curricular changes which would affect the future of this agreement.
