Faculty Accomplishments/Highlights



Professor Win Win Kyi has been invited by Francois Xavier Baugard NGO in Myanmar to conduct on-site post traumatic stress disorder counseling and nationwide counselor training for the victims of Cyclone Nargis. On May 2, 2008, Cyclone Nargis hit land, killing 170,000 people, affecting 2.4 million people and destroying 82,000 areas of land and livelihood. Win Win Kyi will be on site from September 29 to October 4, 2008.

Kaye DeMetz, Associate Professor of Theatre and Speech, was invited to present her research on the ethics of the playwright at the University of Tartu in Estonia. Her presentation, "Theatre As Social Barometer and Civic Leader," was delivered at the University's conference on "Ethics and Theatre," which was held from September 5 to 10.

Harriet Kushins, an adjunct faculty in the Dental Hygiene Program, recently wrote an article entitled, "Smoking Cessation: Oral Health Professionals Can Make an Impact." It was published online in the July issue of the monthly e-newsletter, *Inside Dental Assisting*, a journal for dental assistants. It can be read at: www.insidedentalassisting.com.

Professor Harold Kahn, of the English Department, had his article, "Greyhound Adoption Goes to College: Greyhound Rescue and Adoption Day at Bergen Community College," published in the Fall 2008 issue of *Celebrating Greyhounds Magazine*. The article describes the process of how the event first started at Bergen Community College and how successful it has become. Professor Kahn's photos of the event and those of the Office of Public Relations accompany the article. One of the photos appears on the back cover of the magazine, which has won seven times in the single breed magazine category that is awarded by the Dog Writers Association of America.
