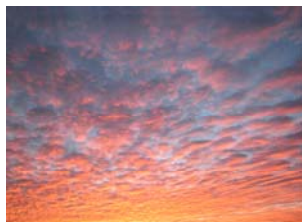

Faculty Accomplishments/Highlights

Professors Gail Fernandez and Maria Kasparova presented "Tech-Enhance Your Class" at the NJTESOL/NJBE Conference at the Garden State Conference Center, in New Jersey, on May 20, 2008.

On Thursday, May 22, 2008, Raymond Smith, Vice President of Student Services, and Kathy Pignatelli, Director of the Wellness Center, received a NJ Governor's Council on Mental Health Stigma Ambassador Award at a ceremony held in Trenton. Bergen received this honor due to the institution's efforts to reduce mental health stigma and raise awareness throughout the College and Bergen County. In April, the College held a "Mental Health Awareness: S.O.S. (Stamp Out Stigma)" program that generated a lot of interest and discussion about the topic of mental health. Other members of the College also attended the ceremony in Trenton including: Barbara Buff, of Health Services, Elaine Korinko, of Wellness and Exercise Science/Athletics, John Giaimo, of the Counseling Center, and Lori McCurley, of the Office of Public Relations.

Gary Konecky, Adjunct Professor of Accounting, spoke to the Radburn Citizens' Association. He discussed generally accepted accounting principles and the required content of financial statements, issued by a common interest realty association.
