Faculty Accomplishments

Dr. George Cronk, Dept. of Philosophy & Religion, recently had his book; *The Message of the Bible: An Orthodox Christian Perspective* (St. Vladimir's Seminary Press, 1990), translated into Bulgarian and published under the title, **Посланието на Библията**, by Omophor Publishing House, Pokrov Foundation, Sofia, Bulgaria, 2007. (The book was also translated into Japanese and published in Kyoto, Japan, in 2005.)
