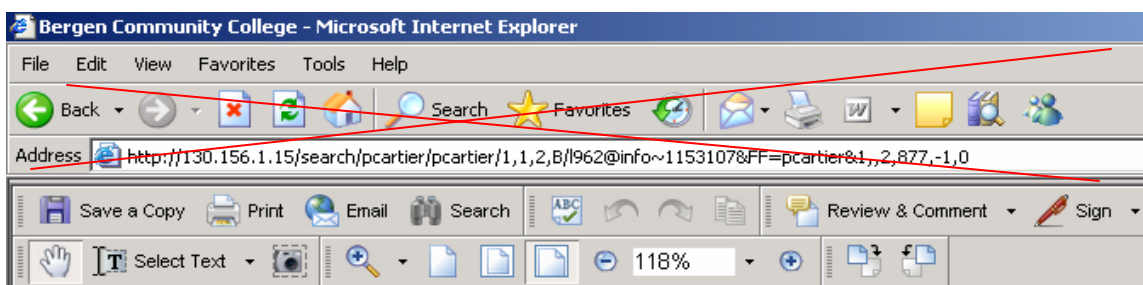

You should still dial-up using your ISP, minimize the screen, and then open the other browser, and use that to navigate to the catalog.
